| <p>(1) Following a decision taken on 14 June 2001 by the Council of WEU, the Secretary-General stated during the 1352nd meeting of the Council on 28 June 2001 that, with regard to the period from 1 January 2002, the Member States deemed it unnecessary, in present and foreseeable circumstances, to make any formal change to the statuses of non-full members.</p> <p>(2) This refers to those States that in 2002 were members both of the European Union and of NATO. Five of these States* (Belgium, France, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and the United Kingdom) were the signatories of the 1948 Brussels Treaty that established the Brussels Treaty Organisation, or Western Union.</p> <p>(3) This refers to those States that in 2002 were members of NATO but not of the European Union.</p> <p>(4) This refers to those States that in 2002 were members of the European Union but not of NATO (European States described as 'neutral'), with the exception of Denmark.</p> <p>(5) This refers to those States that in 2002 were applicant countries of the European Union and not members of NATO.</p> | |
