As a result of the length of time that the Convention's preparations required, the organisation of the 2003-2004 IGC is different from its predecessors:

1) Initially, no meeting was planned for the representatives of the Member States. However, in order to channel the flow of information, the Member States designate contact points or 'focal points' (officials possessing a mainly administrative role).

2) Ministerial meetings: Negotiations take place at foreign minister level. The Commission participates in activities via its representative (Michel Barnier, then António Vitorino). Two European Parliament observers attend meetings (Klaus Hänsch and Íñigo Méndez de Vigo, then Elmar Brok). The governments of the three applicant countries (Bulgaria, Romania, Turkey) participate qua observers.

3) European Council: At Heads of State or Government level, the Commission is represented by its President (Romano Prodi), and Parliament likewise (Pat Cox).

(*) Legal experts' working party: Chaired by M. Piris, Director-General of the Council's Legal Service, it is made up of representatives of the Member States, as well as of the Commission, Parliament and observers from the three applicant countries.
