As the Assembly will already be aware, subsequent events have largely overtaken the Report on which this Recommendation is based.

Proposals have already been made for the creation of a NATO Nuclear Force and are now under consideration in NATO. Initially this Force would be composed of existing forces. Elements of the British and United States strategic forces would be assigned to NATO for the first time. The force would also include certain tactical delivery systems already deployed with NATO forces.

As later weapons are developed, they would be introduced into the NATO nuclear force. This process might include the establishment of a mixed-manned element possibly composed of missile-bearing surface ships, each with an international crew.

The composition of the proposed force, and also the arrangements for command, targetting and control are under discussion in the North Atlantic Council. The matter will be considered further by the Ministerial meeting of the North Atlantic Council at Ottawa on May 22nd - 24th.
